Dr. Fox is one of the first doctors I saw when I came back to the US with gross evidence of dementia and neurodegeneration as a secondary effect of multiple sclerosis.

Dr. Fox reveals the agenda of the US in a very clear way, he states that even if the immunological markers of MS are present he will try to make it irrelevant by ignoring the surrounding medical data to make sure that it doesn't "fit" into the criteria of MS. He ignores surrounding medical data by stating that he "isn't able to open the MRI CD that shows the features of inflammation".

That means play with the diagnostics to avoid the diagnosis of the condition (which they did extensively thereafter).

Its an introverted way of harming a patient. The presentation in the appointment is typical of MS and his statements are "withhold" medications by making false statements till harm takes place due to negligence.

Later in the appointment he professes to not be able to read a 2008 MRI with gross features to support his medical statements in this appointment.

Its was an introverted agenda in the US that Dr. Fox indirectly explained. The idea was simple:

- Ignore the typical features of MS in MRI images or profess to not be able to see them, through the features of MS are often gross and clear.
- Ignore the physical symptoms of the clinical condition in the appointment, though they are clear and apparent in the recoding of the appointment.
- Try to mis typify or downplay the typical features of optic neuropathy, neurodegeneration, dementia, and seizures (which are all typical of MS) as not being typical of MS.
- Ignore the features of neurodegeneration even if the medical diagnostics are gross. (Dr. Fox's essential statement is "not enough neurodegeneration needs more").
- Try to downplay the significance of LP tests unrealistically (even in a patient that has clear video presentations of epileptic seizures when the LP tests are falsified).
- Profess not to be able to read the clinical data (evasiveness) to try and avoid acknowledging the condition, which was done several times in the US to avoid diagnostics.

It's a consistent patterning in the US and it eventuates in gross neurological injury.

Dr. Fox is often abrasive in the appointment as well, which indicates the abrasive quality of the United States in trying to mis portray this case.
